Open Morning Registration

On arrival, please register at the reception desk in Richmonds Restaurant by filling in one of the yellow forms. Staff will be available if you have any queries about completing them. By registering it allows us to be more efficient and speedy in getting you to the most appropriate subject talks in the correct room! Our reception team comprise College staff and current students. They will provide any course literature that you require and also guide you to the welcome talk and follow-up talks from each subject team.

Student Services

Admissions, Learning Support and Finance

As well as course tutors from the various subject teaching areas, you can also speak to staff from our Student Services team who are based in the downstairs foyer area of our Teaching Block (next to Lecture Theatre/opposite Richmonds).

These include representatives from Admissions and Student Services, Inclusive Learning, Accommodation and Student Finance. They will be able to provide information on aspects as diverse as College transport and accommodation, application procedures, course fees, learning support opportunities and student finance. Dedicated Student Finance talks (lasting 15 minutes) will take place in Classroom T10 at the following times:

11.00am, 11.30am and 12noon - Higher Education Student Finance (covering university level fees and student support grants and loans.)

11.15am, 11.45am and 12.15pm - Further Education/School Leaver / post 16 Student Finance (covering student support bursaries and all aspects of student finance.)
