Dear Student

We hope you are keeping safe and well. Here at Myerscough College we are looking forward to welcoming our new and returning students to the Blackburn (Witton Park), Liverpool (Croxteth Park), Warrington (Walton Hall Park) and Old Trafford campuses for the start of the autumn term.

Our plans are to open each campus fully in time for the start of the new academic year in September. The study areas and practical facilities will be available, with a range of robust protective measures in place for the safety and wellbeing of students and staff, as well as for the wider local community.

Teaching arrangements are expected to comprise a blend of some larger group sessions and lectures being possibly delivered online, with small group classes, tutorials and practical sessions delivered face to face in suitably spaced classrooms.
