How We Use Your Personal Information and why we have it

How long we will keep your personal data Your information will be securely destroyed in accordance with the ESFA’s retention and disposal schedule after it is no longer required for these purposes. How we share your personal data Your information may also be shared with other third parties for the above purposes, but only where the law allows it, and the sharing is in compliance with data protection legislation. Your data protection rights Under data protection law, you have rights including:

- Your right of access - You have the right to ask us for copies of your personal information.
