Myerscough life

Leading Lancashire project continues to benefit county's small businesses



A scheme from Myerscough College aimed at benefiting small businesses in Lancashire continues to be a success.

Myerscough is a delivery partner in the Leading Lancashire programme, a project which enables Lancashire's SMEs (less than 250 employees) to develop the leadership and management skills of their workforces to create the leaders of the future, providing the county's SME workforce with access to training focussed on developing skills for current and future managers and leaders, and enabling them to progress into, sustain and develop within leadership management roles.

Short accredited courses from the Institute of Leadership and Management (ILM) and Chartered Management Institute (CMI) offer bespoke training to meet individual employee needs.

By taking part in the Leading Lancashire project, people create their own training plan enabling them to develop effective leadership and management knowledge, skills and behaviours; improve their potential for career development and advancement and gain nationally recognised leadership and management qualifications.

Myerscough retains Disability Confident status



Myerscough College reaffirmed its commitment to equality in the workplace by retaining its status as a Disability Confident Employer.

Disability Confident is a government scheme designed to encourage employers to recruit and retain disabled people and those with health conditions. Myerscough has taken part in the scheme for a number of years, and the accreditation has been confirmed until September, 2023.

The accolade recognises that Myerscough College is dedicated to supporting disabled people and those with health conditions in the workplace, as well as helping other employers to become disability confident themselves.

Myerscough leads scheme to ensure that employers get workers with right skills

Myerscough College is leading the way in offering Lancashire businesses a 'once in a generation' opportunity to shape the future of employers' skills needs.

The Lancashire Local Skills Improvement Plan (LSIP) addresses concerns that employers do not have enough influence over courses and skills offered in local area and struggle to find skilled employees.

This Skills Accelerator also includes the Strategic Development Fund, a £65m investment to help colleges in the implement some of the strategic priorities set out in the local skills improvement plan. In Lancashire, the SDF will be led by Myerscough College on behalf of The Lancashire Colleges.

Lancashire's plan will be submitted to the Department of Education in 2022, with the North and Western Lancashire Chamber of Commerce, working in partnership with the East Lancashire Chamber and supported by Lancaster Chamber, aiming to gather evidence from over 10,000 businesses to develop a clear plan of what skills provision is required in Lancashire.

Myerscough's Arbor Day UK is tree-mendous



Myerscough College staged a special day of celebration of all things trees, in a second annual 'Arbor Day UK'.

The digital event was a celebration of trees, those that work with trees (arborists), and recognition of an important global industry. It was held via a virtual platform due to the ongoing Coronavirus restrictions, and included presentations from some key names in the industry, including Tony Kirkham MBE (Head of Arboretum, Gardens & Horticulture Services, Royal Botanic Gardens, Kew), Ben Jones (Arboretum Curator, at the University of Oxford Botanic Garden & Arboretum), Paul Nolan MBE (Director of The Mersey Forest) and many more, Jon Hammerton, Neil Lucas and other celebrated arboricultural and horticultural experts, who gave talks on a diverse range of topics.

As part of the ongoing plans, many more trees are being planted, a new woodland area is being created at Myerscough's main Bilsborrow campus, and Myerscough's greenspace staff and students are engaging in initiatives with local communities. In recent months, work has continued at Myerscough's main woodland planting site at the College's Bilsborrow campus, planting trees in the 'Rainbow Triangle' – a new woodland being created in memoriam for those that have lost their lives in the Coronavirus pandemic – and as a 'thank you' for NHS and other key workers who are working at the front line.



Myerscough Farm Lodges strategic farm status

Myerscough College's Lodge Farm is part of a national scheme aimed at promoting excellence in the agriculture sector.

The Agriculture and Horticulture Development Board (AHDB)'s strategic dairy farm programme is creating a network of farms, to share good practice through on-farm and virtual events, and giving access to industry experts and the latest research.

The farms also form part of the AHDB's Farm Excellence platform, a network of inspirational farmers who share and create new ideas to drive innovation and productivity.

Myerscough student aiming to complete one of the world's first ever farriery science PhDs



A University Centre Myerscough graduate is aiming to be become one of just four specialists worldwide to hold a doctorate in farriery science.

Norman Johnson is currently working towards the little known qualification and once complete, the 53-year-old will become one of the world's only PhD qualified experts in the sector. Norman first got the idea for doing the PhD whilst studying for a higher education diploma and then a full BSc honours degree in Farriery Science at Myerscough College.

Norman hopes to follow in the footsteps of renowned farrier, and Myerscough College Honorary Fellow, Dr Simon Curtis, and is one of just three specialists currently world wide known to have a PhD in the area. Myerscough collaborate on major climate change project



Myerscough College is a project partner in a major drive to remove greenhouse gases from the atmosphere.

As part of a UK Research and Innovation (UKRI) investment of £30 million over four-and-a-half years, researchers at Aberystwyth University's Institute for Biological, Environmental and Rural Sciences (IBERS) will lead a consortium of partners to develop biomass crops.

The results will be used to shape longer-term government decision-making on the most effective technologies to help tackle climate change and reduce CO2 emissions in order to meet net zero carbon emissions by 2050.

Alongside project partners, including Myerscough, they will be demonstrating the latest technologies for planting willow and Miscanthus, the two perennial biomass crops that are best suited to UK conditions.

Specifically, Myerscough's involvement in the research includes new field trials on College land, hosting willow and miscanthus plots. Both crops grow well on land that is less suited to food production, and can be harvested every one to three years.

Myerscough retains status as a Leader in Diversity

Myerscough College retained the prestigious 'Leaders in Diversity' award, continuing to be a leading provider in equality, diversity and inclusion in the education sector.

Leaders in Diversity Award

The 'Investors in Diversity' quality mark is awarded to establishments who strive to improve practices within their organisation. Myerscough landscaping apprentice named the best in the UK

A Myerscough College apprentice was named the best in the UK after winning gold at the Association of Professional Landscapers (APL) WorldSkills UK final.

Cameron Barker was crowned champion in landscaping at a prestigious award ceremony. The 2021 WorldSkills competition saw Cameron compete alongside the other finalists from across the country to be crowned the UK's best young landscaper.

The finalists had to build a fully landscaped garden to a set specification, incorporating water and lighting features, paving, decking, turf and numerous other elements, including designing a plan for the project, which they then had 16.5 hours to complete over three days of the final.

Designed by industry experts, the WorldSkills UK Competitions equip apprentices and learners with the world-class skills needed to help UK businesses better compete globally. Competitors underwent a seven-month process of regional heats and intensive training before stepping up to pit their skills against the best of the best.

Foundation learners thrive on Supported Internships



A scheme aimed at getting young people who need extra help to move into employment, run by Myerscough College's Foundation Learning department, continues to go from strength to strength.

Supported Internships are aimed at young people who want to move into employment and are intended to enable the young person to become 'job ready'. Internships normally last for one year and they include a work placement. Students complete a personalised Study Programme working towards a qualification, usually 'Employability Skills'. Maths and English are also delivered as an important element.

A number of Myerscough's current group of foundation learners are undertaking a supported internship programme, working at a number of local businesses, all significantly benefiting and improving their life skills and employment prospects.

Full steam ahead for Myerscough College rail apprenticeships



The apprentices are employed within Northern Trains and East Midlands Railway depots across the country.

They spend part of their programme as residential learners at Myerscough College's main campus at Bilsborrow, and then the remainder at their work depots with their host employers. They also spend periods of time with the National Training Academy for Rail (NTAR) in Northampton.

Myerscough College has a long and proven track record of delivering a range of engineering apprenticeships, including pathways within the rail, groundscare, agriculture, crane and construction industries, supporting around 150 apprentices with their training across the country. Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM) remains a key driver and focus in terms of Myerscough apprenticeships and education provision, and the number of apprentices in this area is growing rapidly.

Myerscough supports mental health and wellbeing



Myerscough College continues its commitment to staff and students by being part of a national mental health and wellbeing charter.

The charter, which was been created by the Association of Colleges, in conjunction with mental health experts, is an 11-point document, which includes commitments to:

The 2021 Streetstock 125 British Championship ran across circuits such as Donington Park, Anglesey Trac mon, Pembrey, Darley Moor & Three Sisters, with Ryan securing the title with one race to spare.

As part of their study programme, learners undertake their motorcycle study programme at Myerscough's new Motorcycle Centre at the College's main Bilsborrow campus, on courses designed to give students skills and knowledge in diagnosing and repairing any type of motorcycles, as part of a tailored course incorporating motorsport activities and resources to provide progression into the motorsports industry.

Agriculture students over the moo-n with Christmas Calf Show



Agriculture students staged their annual Christmas Calf Show.

The event is organised by the College's Level 2 Agriculture students, and involves the training and then parading of a variety of dairy heifers and beef cross calves, which were prepared for the show at Myerscough's Livestock Innovation Centre, part of the College's Lodge Farm complex.

Every year the students spend months planning and preparing for the event, with the Christmas Calf show now an annual fixture in the Myerscough calendar. The student's hard work and stockmanship shows how they have developed their skills and confidence in handling and showing the animals, as well as taking pride in both their own appearance and that of their animal.

World-renowned horticulturalist works with Walton learners



Students at Myerscough College's Warrington campus have been working with a world-renowned horticulturalist thanks to a new partnership.

Myerscough has been based at Walton Hall and Gardens since, with the classroom and learning environment at Walton Estate was made possible thanks to a two-million-pound grant from the National Lottery Heritage Fund.

Don Billington has moved into the glasshouses on the site, where his collection now lives, as well as Don being on hand to work with the latest group of Myerscough horticulture students.

Don is a world-renowned Bromeliad expert, specialising in Bromeliads and having three National Collections of Aechmea, Billbergia and Neoregelia. The collection in question is bigger than that found at Kew, Wisley and Edinburgh Botanical gardens, making the move perfect for both Don, Walton Hall, and the Myerscough students, who are able to get a unique, first-hand experience of dealing with such plants.

£1.3million project launched to train mechanics in electric and hybrid repairs



Myerscough College and University Centre is part of a £1.3million project designed to train mechanics how to repair electric and hybrid vehicles.

Myerscough is involved in the Lancashire Automotive Skills Accelerator Project funded by the Department for Education, which will bridge the skills gap in low-carbon vehicle mechanics.

The scheme aims to create low-carbon skills centres across the county, providing significant investment in cutting-edge technologies and upskilling teachers to ensure that study programmes meet the needs of employers and the industry.

The project also aims to support the Government's commitment to withdrawing the sale of new petrol or diesel cars in 2030, and will also create a range of new short courses to meet employer needs, whilst Master Technicians will deliver masterclasses for staff and students.

Our Partnerships

Myerscough launch Cumbrian partnership with Ullswater Community College



Myerscough College successfully launched an exciting, new, land-based educational offer for Cumbria.

The 2021-22 academic year saw agriculture, animal studies and arboriculture further education programmes run as a partnership between Myerscough College and Ullswater Community College, near Penrith.

The collaboration recognises the importance of the future of the land-based sector, and in particular, the agriculture, animal management and arboriculture sectors to the county, and how vital it is that the next generation have the best possible opportunity to obtain high level qualifications locally.

Learners follow a blended learning model where learners still live at home, while enjoying the benefit of quality, local, academic study, with theory and classroom sessions in Penrith, combined with additional weekly travel to Myerscough College, where practical elements are taught in state-of-theart, sector leading facilities, as well as the opportunities to study in the workplace or residentially at Myerscough.

Students will be taught in state-of-the-art, sector leading facilities, which have recently benefited from a £35m investment in the past few years. This work includes the opening of a state-of-the-art, multi-million-pound Food and Farming Innovation & Technology Centre ('FFIT'), the only one of its kind in the UK, incorporating AfiFarm 5.2 dairy technology and a new Livestock Innovation Centre incorporating Growsafe feeding technology.

Myerscough College has three farms, a specialist rural skills centre and an off-road driving course for developing skills with tractors, trailers, 4WD vehicles and quadbikes.

The Agricultural and Horticultural Development Board (AHDB) recently made Myerscough's Lodge Farm a Strategic Dairy Farm, adding the farm to the AHDB's Farm Excellence platform, a network of inspirational farmers who share and create new ideas to drive innovation and productivity and share good practice nationally.

Our Animal Studies Centre has recently tripled in size after the completion of a £3 million extension and major refurbishment, while Myerscough also boasts fantastic arboriculture facilities, with an international reputation for excellence and is home to the purpose-built National Centre for Arboriculture.

Furness College animal partnership goes from strength to strength

An animal studies partnership between Myerscough College and Furness College has gone from strength-to-strength.

The programme, launched in September, 2020, has allowed the first cohort of students to take their first steps into animal management careers, in either a Level 2 Technical Certificate



in Animal Care or Level 3 Animal Management Technical Diploma.

Learning is spread across both centres, where students learn theory at Furness's sixth form campus in Barrow, and travel weekly to work with animals in Myerscough's £3 million, state-of-the-art, Animal Studies Centre, at the College's main Bilsborrow campus. They will also enjoy the chance to do field work and work experience in Furness and the South Lakes. During the programme, they will go on to learn about animal behaviour, genetics and conservation.

Myerscough's Animal Studies Centre houses the following specialist facilities: an aquarium of tropical and cold water amphibians and crustaceans, herpetology room housing species from all continents, a cattery - working in partnership with Blue Cross, a brand new lemur enclosure, dog day-kennels, a tortoise enclosure, farmyard animals, including goats, sheep, geese, ducks, alpacas and emus, fully equipped grooming parlour and canine hydrotherapy unit, international equine arena, housing for over 50 horses and equine hydrotherapy, aviaries housing birds from around the world, specialist veterinary and veterinary nursing staff and facilities including x-ray facilities, intensive care beds, operating theatres and patient referral rooms, an exotics rooms (including Gambian pouched rats and sugar gliders), free range poultry paddocks, rabbits and guinea pigs enclosures, ferrets enclosures and Scottish Wildcat enclosures (part of national conservation programme).

Myerscough partners with UCLan to create prestigious Veterinary School

Myerscough College and University Centre is partnering with the University of Central Lancashire to create the county's first Veterinary School.



The opening in September 2022 will see the provision become the 11th Veterinary School in the UK and Lancashire's first.

The new Veterinary School will deliver foundation, undergraduate and postgraduate courses in areas such as veterinary medicine, bioveterinary science, veterinary clinical practice, veterinary physiotherapy and rehabilitation, and clinical animal behaviour and training.

Myerscough is collaborating with UCLan and local veterinary partners to deliver certain programmes of study. Students will benefit from Myerscough's renowned animal training facilities which have underpinned established Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons (RCVS) accredited vet nursing programmes, alongside UCLan's experience of establishing leading UK medical, dental, pharmacy and optometry schools with significant and continuing investment in state-of-the-art clinical training facilities.

By becoming an official partner, Myerscough became a Development Centre for 14-16-year-olds, who were given a fantastic opportunity to attend a specialist programme in technical and tactical aspects, gameplay and strength and conditioning, at the College's main Preston campus.

Young people on the programme received training from Myerscough College Cricket Preston's Head Coach and Programme Leader, James Wiggan, alongside Root Academy coaches, with an opportunity for participants to apply to enrol in Myerscough's range of further education BTEC cricket study programmes, and also for current students to get involved and develop their skills.

The R66T Academy Camps are a snapshot of the High-Performance Programme that is held for elite players in Australia that Joe Root participated in as a 20-year-old, and include a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to spend a year in Australia to receive further expert coaching and experiences.

Myerscough's basketballers are European history makers



Myerscough College's basketballers became champions of Europe after winning the European Youth Basketball League (EYBL) regular season.

Myerscough College's Basketball Academy won all of their five games in the third and final stage in Valmiera, Latvia, to finish with a record of 14 wins from their 15 games across three stages, including 12 straight victories. The under-20 competition regular season is staged across three weekends throughout the year, and usually concludes with a Final Four and Superfinal, that was unable to take place due to the Coronavirus pandemic.

The EYBL is one of the premier FIBA competitions for juniors and features renowned teams from across the continent, with Myerscough joining the Under-20 'Euroleague' format tournament. The U20 league table comprises of seventeen teams from different countries across the continent, with Myerscough's record ensuring they finished top of the table. It is only Myerscough College's second season of competing in the EYBL. In 2019, Myerscough came within a whisker of becoming overall champions, losing in the Superfinal.

Neal Hopkins, Myerscough's Basketball Programme Leader, said: ''I've poured my life into basketball for as long as I can remember to earn a moment like this. This is a moment in British basketball history that will forever belong to Myerscough College!

"Playing in the EYBL has provided our players, staff and the programme with an amazing opportunity to gain experience playing at a very high level against some of the best U20 teams in Europe.

"The thing we've really learned over the last 12 months is the effectiveness of the British style in Europe. The boys have bought into what we as a coaching staff are trying to preach and that makes us a difficult team to play against."

The group were all in contention to make the Great Britain squads for the summer tournaments. Myerscough Basketball Academy had eight players in total, including four alumni, named to their respective age groups at the U20 and U18 levels.
